The Abbé was a younger son but he was not without financial resources, as his father owned property in Paris and at Saint-Non (modern Saint Nom) and La Bretèche. Born in Paris, in 1748 he was graduated in theology from the Sorbonne and took minor religious orders; later he bought a benefice, becoming in 1758 abbé commendataire of the abbey of Pothières near Châtillon-sur-Seine, Burgundy
